

Ordinance No. 126,
An Ordinance to Prohibit the use of Fire works.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany.

- Sec I It shall be unlawful for any person to ignite, fire or explode any fire crackers, bombs, explosives, or other fireworks of any description whatsoever within the following limits in the City of Albany: namely that portion of said City of Albany lying between Third Street and the Willamette River, and extending from Vine Street to Jackson Street.
- Sec II Any person who shall have ignited, fired, exploded any fire crackers, bomb, explosive or other fireworks whatsoever in violation of Section I hereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five dollars, or imprisonment not exceeding two days.
- Sec III Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Sec IV This Ordinance to be in force from and after five days after its publication.
