

Ordinance No. 184.

An Ordinance defining and regulating the uniform to be worn by Police Officers

The people of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows.

Section 1 That from and after the first day of February 1889 the City Marshall and all other police Officers of the City of Albany shall wear while on duty a neat uniform consisting of a dark navy blue prince Albert coat made of heavy pilot cloth with a prussian collar, buttons of suitable size and of gold color, pants made of heavy navy blue pilot cloth, vest of like material and made to correspond with the coat. And a private or patrolmans cap, or a military or grandammy hat corresponding in style with the coat and pants with a wreath surrounding the word City "Marshal" or "Police Officer" attached to cap or hat just above the rim thereof.

Section 2. That each police officer shall be furnished by the City with a twelve inch Beaus patent police Club which shall be carried by the officer unconcealed,

Section 3 The uniform herein provided for shall be furnished by the officer and be and remain his property, the police Club provided for in this ordinance to be furnished by the city, and to be and remain the property of the City.

Section 4. This Ordinance to take effect on
the first day of February 1889.

Passed the Council January 7th 1889.

Be came a law as provided by Section 4.
