

Ordinance 266.

An Ordinance appropriating money for the purpose of securing the piers of the Bridge over the Willamette River at the northern terminus of Calapooia Street in the City of Albany against high water; appointing Jason Wheeler to superintend the work of securing said piers and authorizing the Committee on Streets and Public Property of said City to let the contract for such work.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

1892

Section 1: That the sum of five hundred dollars and no more, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of said City of Albany to be expended in protecting the piers of the Wagon bridge over the Willamette River at the northern terminus of Calapooia Street in said City against high water. And the Committee on Streets and Public Property of said City are authorized to immediately let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder for said work. And be it further enacted that Jason Wheeler be and he is hereby appointed to superintend the putting in of such work.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
