Restricting sale of eatables on depot grounds

An Ordinance prohibiting and restricting the sale and disposing of eatables in and upon the Southern Pacific Passenger Depot grounds within the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, fixing a penalty therefor.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

- Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to sell, or offer for sale, or otherwise dispose of, for value, any wares and commodities, coffee, fruit, berries or other eatables whatever, in and upon the Southern Pacific Passenger Depot grounds in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, East of the East line of said Passenger Depot, if extended in a Southern or Northern direction from the Passenger Depot building, or at any point or point East of the railroad tracks, on said Depot grounds.
- Section 2. This Ordinance shall not apply to any employee of the Railway Company or News Company in the discharge of his ordinary duties upon a Railway train or car.
- Section 3. Any person guilty of a violation of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, be punished by a fine not less than \$5.00 or more than \$20.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than two days or more than 10 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
