

Relating to time & manner, during part of Ferry Street from Third to Ninth.

 Relating to time & manner of during part of Ferry Street from Third to Ninth

An Ordinance providing for the time and manner for improving Ferry Street in the City of Albany, from the North curb line of Third Street to the North curb line of Ninth Street, providing how the cost of such improvement shall be paid, the penalty or damages that shall be paid to the City of Albany by the person or persons making such improvement, and the same shall not be completed within the time agreed upon, and the giving of a good and sufficient bond for the faithful performance of the work of such improvement of said street, and providing for the giving of the record of said City Engineer for bids for the completion of such improvement of said part of said street.

The Board of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Ferry Street from the North curb line of Third Street to the North curb line of Ninth Street shall be improved in the following manner, to wit: -

First: By grading said street to the proper subgrade.

Second: By paving the roadway of said street full width with - all intersections with Rittinitis Government.

Third: By laying and constructing Rittinitis Headers.

Fourth: By constructing Gullys.

Fifth: By constructing Catch Basins.

Sixth: By laying vitrified Sewer Pipe.

Said improvements to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Albany, and the Plans, Specifications and estimates of the City Engineer of said City for the improvement of Ferry Street, filed in the office of the City Recorder of said City of Albany, on the 10th day of Nov. 1909, endorsed City Engineer's Plans and Specifications for the improvement of Ferry Street from the North curb line of Third Street to the North curb line of Ninth

Street, and the estimates of the work to be done
 on said street and the probable cost thereof.
 The cost of the said improvement of
 said portion of said Ferry Street at the
 crossings or intersections thereof by
 Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and
 Eighth Streets, and that portion of Ninth
 Street lying between the North curb
 line of Ninth Street and the North line
 thereof, shall be paid by the City of Albany,
 out of the general fund of the said
 City; the remaining portion of the
 cost of said improvement of said Ferry
 Street, shall be paid out of the funds to
 be collected and arising upon and out of the
 assessment heretofore made, abe-
 tained and declared by Ordinance No.
 504 passed by the Council of said City
 of Albany, on the 23rd day of March
 1910, and approved by the Mayor of
 said City on the 25th day of March 1910,
 on the lots and parts of lots adjacent to
 said portion of said Ferry Street to be
 so improved, and especially, and particu-
 larly, benefitted thereby, as provided
 by the Charter of said City.

The said improvement of said Ferry
 Street shall be completed by the first
 day of October 1910. All bids for the
 making of said improvement of
 said Ferry Street, deemed unreason-
 able by the Council of said City,
 may be rejected.

Any firm, corporation or person
 with which, or with whom any
 contract may be entered into by
 said City for the making of said
 improvement shall, before com-
 mencing said improvement and
 at the time of signing such con-
 tract make, execute and deliver to
 said City in a good and sufficient bond
 with good and sufficient security in

Relating to the manner of doing part of
Ferry Street from Third to 7th Streets.

The sum of \$5000.00 for the faithful performance
of such contract.

Section 2. If the firm, corporation or
person entering into any contract with
the said City of Albany, to make said im-
provement of said Ferry Street shall ^{not}
complete the same within the time ^{mentioned} speci-
fied in such contract, said City shall be
deemed to suffer damage on account
thereof to the amount of \$25.00 per day
for each and every day the completion of
said work is delayed beyond the time
stated in such contract, which amount
shall be paid by such contractor doing
the work at the completion thereof, unless
the time of the completion of said improve-
ment is extended by the Council. All
pavement shall be laid in dry and suit-
able weather ^{and not otherwise}.

Section 3. The Recorder of said City
is hereby ordered and directed to immedi-
ately give proper notice for bids for the
making of said improvement of said por-
tion of said Ferry Street, by publishing
such notice ten days in the Albany Daily
Democrat, a daily newspaper published
daily in said City of Albany, fully de-
scribing in such notice the time and
manner of doing the work of said
improvement of said Ferry Street.

Section 4. Inasmuch as there
is urgent necessity for ^{and} the
general welfare of said City demands
the immediate improvement of said
street, in the manner aforesaid, in
order that the same may be com-
pleted before the rainy season sets
in, an emergency is hereby declared
to exist and this Ordinance shall be
in full force and effect from ^{and}
after its passage by said Council, and
its approval by the Mayor of said
City.
