ORDINANCE NO. 1368

AN ORDINANCE regulating dances and dance halls, requiring a license for operating a dance for profit, providing for a penalty for violation hereof and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and repealing Ordinance No. 1290, passed by the Council August 22, 1928, and approved by the Mayor August 28, 1928;

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the term "dance hall", as used herein shall be construed to be any hall, room, pavilion, or place, except a private residence, in which a dance is held. The term "dance" as used in this ordinance shall include any class or school in which instruction in dancing is given for hire, and every dance not held in a private home or residence.

Section 2. All dances and dance halls shall be open for inspection by the police officers of the City of Albany at any and all times.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of every person, club, society or association, their officers, agents and employees, giving or conducting a dance to conduct the same in a proper and decorous manner; that no person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted or allowed to be or remain within the dance hall or in the hallway, entrance or stairs leading thereto or in any anteroom thereof while any dance is being conducted within said dance hall.

Section 4. All dances shall be discontinued and all dances shall be closed on or before twelve o'clock midnight; provided however, that upon previous written permission granted by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon, said dance may be conducted and said hall remain open until the time mentioned in such permit, but no tickets shall be sold or accepted for admission to such dance hall after the hour of twelve o'clock midnight.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful to permit or suffer any person under the age of sixteen years to take part in any dance or to remain in such hall after the hour of nine o'clock P.M., unless such person be accompanied by his or her parent or lawful guardian.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person under the influence of intoxicating liquor to enter any dance hall or any hallway, or any anteroom leading thereto or remain therein during the progress of any dance.

Section 7. Any person, club, society or association, their officers, agents and employees, giving or conducting dances for profit, shall, before giving such dance procure a license therefor from the City Recorder, which said license shall be based upon the following schedule:

For one day -----	\$ 6.00
For one month -----	12.00
For three months -----	18.00
For six months -----	30.00
For one year -----	60.00

Any dance the net proceeds of which are given to or used for benevolence, charitable or public purposes, shall not be deemed to be given for profit within the meaning of this ordinance and in such cases no license fee therefor shall obtain.

Section 8. Any person, club, society or association, their officers, agents and employees, intending to give or conduct a dance for a benevolent, charitable or public purpose or benefit shall at least three days prior to giving or conducting such dance obtain from the City Recorder the written permit to give and conduct the same, and it shall be unlawful to give or conduct such dance without a written permit therefor.

Section 9. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof in the Recorder's Court of the City of Albany shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars or by imprisonment in the City Jail for not more than twenty-five days.

Section 10. That Ordinance No. 1290, passed by the Council August 22, 1928, and approved by the Mayor August 28, 1928, be and the same is hereby repealed.
