

ORDINANCE NO. 1713

A BILL FOR:

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany Oregon, to enter into a contract with D. F. McKenzie for the improvement of Hill Street from the South line of Fourth Street to the north line of Fifth St. in the City of Albany, Oregon.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 1706 of the City of Albany, Oregon it was ordered that the following street in said city be improved, to-wit: Hill Street from the south line of Fourth Street to the North line of Fifth Street.

Said improvement to be made in the following manner:

1. By grading said street to the proper grade.
2. By installing concrete curbs wherever necessary.
3. By making all other proper installations to completely improve said Street.
4. By surfacing the roadway of said St. full width with full intersections with crushed rock and crushed gravel base and oil mat surface.

and in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates of Walter W. Larsen, Engineer, then on file in the office of the Recorder of said City and:

WHEREAS, it was provided in said Ordinance that the Recorder of said City of Albany give notice for bids for the making of said improvement in the manner provided by law and said Ordinance and:

WHEREAS, after due notice and advertisement for bids made and given by the Recorder according to law and the Ordinance last aforesaid, to-wit: on the 22nd day of May, 1946, D. F. McKenzie presented to the Council of the City of Albany his bid for making said improvement in the manner aforesaid, which bid was made in due form and in conformity with all the conditions imposed by law and the Council, by which said bid D. F. McKenzie proposed to furnish all the material and implements and perform all the labor necessary to make the above described improvement for the following names prices, to-wit:

Aggregate bid based on Engineer's estimates \$1481.80.

AND WHEREAS, the said D. F. McKenzie was the lowest bidder for said proposed work and said bid was the lowest and best bid made therefore.

Section 1. That the bid of D. F. McKenzie for the improvement of Hill Street from the south line of fourth street to the North line of fifth Street, in the City of Albany, Oregon, in the manner as specified in said Ordinance No. 1706 be and the same is hereby accepted and the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract in writing with the said D. F. McKenzie for the making of said improvement on behalf of the City of Albany upon the terms mentioned in said bid hereinabove mentioned and in the manner and form provided by law.

Said contract shall provide further that the work of said improvement shall commence within ten days after the signing of said contract and shall be prosecuted with such vigor that all the work embraces in said contract shall be entirely completed on or before the first day of Oct. 1946 unless further time be extended by the Council of said City, and the City of Albany, Oregon, shall be deemed to suffer damages in the amount of \$25.00 per day for each and every day said work is delayed beyond said specified time, and that the said D. F. McKenzie shall furnish a bond in the sum of \$740.90 to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of said contract on the part of the said D. F. McKenzie and further indemnifying the City of Albany against any claim or lien for labor or work or material on the part of any person, firm or corporation, arising out of said contract.
