

ORDINANCE NO. 2695

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND THE VOLUNTEER MEMBERS OF THE SAID DEPARTMENTS.

Recitals:

1. The requirements of the State Industrial Accident Commission, in covering the members and volunteer members of the fire department and of the police department, require that the duties thereof be defined.

2. The City of Albany has determined that members and volunteer members of the separate departments be covered by the State Industrial Accident Commission while engaged in duties serving the City of Albany, Oregon, the surrounding community and those rural fire districts with which the City of Albany, Oregon, maintains contractual relations or with other cities through mutual aid agreements.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY, OREGON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The duties of the members of the Albany Fire Department shall be as follows:

- (a) To engage in fire fighting and all duties incidental thereto, including training and instruction, and the aiding and assisting of other departments.
- (b) To engage in rescue work, both on land and water.
- (c) To engage in the installation and removal of street decorations and flood lights on the various streets, athletic fields and parks.
- (d) To man, operate, use, ride upon, or in, or assist with the necessary equipment to carry out the above duties.
- (e) To engage in the operation of an ambulance service, including emergency first aid.

Section 2: The duties of volunteer firemen who are members of the Volunteer Fire Department of the City of Albany, Oregon, as described in Ordinance No. 2195, shall be to aid, and assist the regular department and engage in the duties described in Section 1, with the exception of those items described in sub-section C of Section 1.

Section 3: The duties of the members of the Albany Police Department shall be as follows:

- (a) To engage in crime prevention and investigation.
- (b) To maintain law and order within the City of Albany, Oregon.
- (c) To engage in traffic control.
- (d) To engage in the control of crowds.
- (e) To engage in and assist in all matters incidental to the above.

Section 4: The duties of the Reserve Police Officers as described in Ordinance No. 1865, shall be to aid, and assist the regular department and engage in the duties described in Section 3.
