

ORDINANCE NO. 3554

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF TWENTY-FIRST AVENUE BETWEEN FERRY AND WASHINGTON STREETS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Albany did by Resolution No. 1303, passed by the Council at the council meeting on the 10th day of March, 1971, set the hour of 7:15 p.m. on the 28th day of April, 1971, as the time of hearing of objections to the proposed vacation of a portion of 21st Avenue, between Ferry and Washington Streets, as hereinafter described, and did direct the City Recorder to publish and post notice of said proposed vacation as required by law, and

WHEREAS, the said notice has been posted and published as required by law, and

WHEREAS, the said hearing on the 28th day of April, 1971, has been duly held and parties were given an opportunity to be heard and the Council being fully informed,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That portion of Twenty-first (21st) Avenue between Ferry and Washington Streets, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2: EMERGENCY CLAUSE

Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Albany, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
