

ORDINANCE NO. 3783

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6.04.170 OF THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN ACTS OF DOGS SHALL CONSTITUTE A NUISANCE FOR WHICH THE OWNER THEREOF SHALL BE LIABLE AND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO KEEP A DOG THAT CONSTITUTES A PUBLIC NUISANCE AS DEFINED.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That Section 6.04.170 of the Albany Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"Section 6.04.170. Circumstances under which a dog is a public nuisance.

A dog shall be considered a public nuisance under the meaning of this ordinance in the following instances:

- (a) Any dog, when unprovoked, bites any person or persons;
- (b) Any dog which chases vehicles or when off the premises of the owner or keeper chases any person or persons;
- (c) Any dog which scatters garbage other than that of its owner or keeper;
- (d) Any dog which habitually trespasses on public or private property. (Trespass of more than two occasions shall be considered habitual under the meaning of this section.)
- (e) Any dog which through its barking disturbs the peace and repose of the immediate neighborhood.
- (f) Any dog running at large as defined in Section 6.04.150 of the Albany Municipal Code.
