ORDINANCE NO. 5581

AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY AN ASSESSMENT AGAINST A PROPERTY SPECIFICALLY BENEFITED BY A REQUIRED SEWER CONNECTION AT 1410 HOP STREET SW AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2004, the Albany City Council passed Resolution 4928, which proclaimed a Health Hazard at 1410 Hop Street SW and allowed an Exception to the General Prohibition Against Extraterritorial Sewer Extensions; and

WHEREAS, the owner/occupants of 1410 Hop Street SW were unable to obtain financing to pay the \$8,331 in City of Albany Sewer Connection Fees and Sewer System Development Charges; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2004, the City of Albany Public Works Department, with the cooperation of the owner/occupants of 1410 Hop Street SW, initiated Nuisance Abatement procedures to facilitate the connection of the house to the City sewer system and to place a lien on the property for the required fees; and

WHEREAS, the house was connected to the City sewer system on July 9, 2004.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: <u>Subject Property</u>. The property benefiting from the sewer connection is Lot 1, Block 24 of Hazelwood Addition subdivision, currently addressed as 1410 Hop Street SW.

<u>Section2</u>: <u>Costs to be Liened</u>. Sewer Connection fee for Lot 1 = (150 feet x \$41/foot) = \$6,150. Sewer System Development Charge = \$2,181. Total Lien amount is \$8,331.

<u>Section 3</u>: The City Recorder is hereby directed to enter a statement of assessment as above provided in the docket of the City liens and give notice thereof as provided by law.

<u>Section 4 Emergency Clause</u>. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the citizens of this city of Albany, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist; and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council.

RESOLUTION NO. 4928

A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING A "HEALTH HAZARD" AT 1410 HOP STREET SW TO ALLOW AN EXCEPTION TO THE GENERAL PROHIBITION AGAINST EXTRATERRITORIAL SEWER EXTENSIONS.

WHEREAS, the Albany City Council voted on September 8, 1999, to approve Ordinance No. 5419, which created a health hazard exception to the general prohibition against extraterritorial sewer extensions, and

WHEREAS, in order for a property to be eligible for this health hazard exception, the City Council must determine that the criteria in AMC 10.01.050(5) are met, and

WHEREAS, the findings attached as Exhibit A show that the criteria for the property located at 1410 Hop Street SW have been met,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Albany City Council adopt the findings attached as Exhibit A; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Albany City Council that the property at 1410 Hop Street SW is eligible to receive city sanitary sewer service as allowed in AMC 10.01.050(5); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city will require the property owners to satisfy all requirements set forth in AMC 10.01.050(5) prior to receiving said city sanitary sewer service.



NOTICE TO ABATE NUISANCE – SANITARY SEWER CONNECTION REQUIRED FOR 1410 HOP STREET SW

Since December of 2003 we have been working with you and the Linn County Environmental Health Department to eliminate the heath hazard caused by the untreated sewage discharge on your property at 1410 Hop Street SW. You have informed us that you cannot obtain financing for the required \$8,331 in sewer System Development Charges and Connection Fees. The City of Albany Public Works Department has agreed to use our Nuisance Abatement procedure found in Albany Municipal Code 10.01.160 to "finance" those fees by allowing you to connect to the City sewer after which we will place a lien on your property for those fees.

Pursuant to AMC 10.01.160, you are hereby given 30 days, (until August 1, 2004,) to abate the nuisance at 1410 Hop Street SW. If you do not eliminate the nuisance by that date, "the City may abate the nuisance and the cost of abatement, including but not limited to, the cost of all permits, system development charges, construction fees and material costs shall be assessed against the real property", AMC 10.01.160 (3d).

Per our July 1, 2004, telephone conversation, you agreed to perform the private plumbing work needed to connect your home's plumbing to city sewer. I agreed that if you send a letter to me in which you waive the 30 day abatement notification period and ask us to proceed immediately with the abatement procedure, we will only lien your property for the System Development Charge and the Connection Fee, totaling \$8,331. Once we have received your letter we will release your permit to connect to the sewer and we will install a service line from the city sewer main in Hop Street to your property line.

As you know, you also need to properly abandon the septic tank and eliminate the sewage pool west of your house. Although you have signed an Irrevocable Request to Annex to the City of Albany, you must obtain plumbing and septic tank abandonment permits from Linn County because your property is still under the County's jurisdiction.
