

RESOLUTION NO. 2670

WHEREAS, the City of Albany is responsible for the maintenance and operation of 126 miles of public streets which are essential to the movement of people and the conduct of commerce; and


WHEREAS, a properly constructed and maintained street system is an important element of public infrastructure which must be provided to enable the community to attract and to hold business and industry; and

WHEREAS, a pavement management study just completed by the City reveals that approximately \$12 million will be required in the next few years to rebuild or resurface 68% of the street system; and

WHEREAS, a 1986 study by the state, counties, and cities has reported that the entire 42,000-mile road system in the state requires substantial additional resources now to prevent deterioration to a serious degree.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor and Legislative Assembly be urged to address in 1987 the statewide needs for increased dedicated road user fees and the gap of more than \$1 billion that exists in the next six years between current revenues and current needs.
