

## Ordinance No. 113

An Ordinance providing for the erection of an Engine House and appropriating money therefor:

Ord 710  
113

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany:

Section I. That the sum of two thousand and five hundred dollars, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the City Treasury not otherwise appropriated or so much of said sum as may be necessary to defray the expense of erecting an Engine House for the purpose of housing the steam fire engine, known as Lion Engine No. 2.

Section II. That immediately on this Ordinance taking effect, the Recorder of the City of Albany shall advertise for seal of bids or proposals in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 15, of the City of Albany, for the erection of an Engine House for the purpose of housing Lion Engine No. 2, on the lot on which the House of said Engine now stands; said House to be built in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the Office of the Recorder of said City.

Section III. The Common Council shall let the contract for the erection of the Engine House, herein before mentioned, to the lowest responsible bidder, provided the Council may if they deem proper let the contract for supplying material for said building, and for the erection of the said building separately, or otherwise.

Section IV. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after five days after its passage.
