Ordinance No. 289

for Ordinance to change, and establish the grade of the Streets, and sidewalks in the City of Albany, Oregon.

The People of the City of Albany, do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the center line of the finished grade of First street, between Washington street, and Lyon street, and of Lyon street between First street, and South street, in the City of Albany, Oregon, shall be eighteen (18) inches above the level of the gutter line of said streets, as now established.

Section 2. That the center line of the finished grade of each, and every street in the City of Albany, except that portion of First street, and of Lyon street, as mentioned, and described in section one of this Ordinance, shall be twenty (20) inches above the level of the gutter line of such streets.

Section 3. That, the grade of the decking of all sidewalks shall be on a level with the grade of the center line of the street on which they shall be respectively located.

Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in so far as they conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section 5.

This ordinance shall be in full force, and effect from, and after its approval by the Mayor.
