

## Ordinance No 290.

An Ordinance to amend Section Three (3) of Ordinance No 276, passed by the Council January 23<sup>rd</sup> 1894, and approved by the Mayor January 26<sup>th</sup> 1894, entitled, "An Ordinance to amend Section (3) Three, and Section (5) Five of Ordinance No 141, entitled, "An Ordinance to license, tax, and regulate certain Callings, trades, and employments, and to provide for the manner of issuing licenses," passed by the Council February, 9<sup>th</sup> 1886, and approved by the Mayor February, 10<sup>th</sup> 1886.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 1: That Section 2 of Ordinance number 276, passed by the Council January, 23<sup>rd</sup> 1894, and approved by the Mayor January 26<sup>th</sup> 1894, entitled, "An Ordinance to amend Section (3) Three, and Section (5) Five of Ordinance No 141, entitled, "An Ordinance to license, tax, and regulate certain Callings, trades, and employments, and to provide for the manner of issuing licenses," passed by the Council February, 4<sup>th</sup> 1886, and approved by the Mayor February, 10<sup>th</sup> 1886," be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2: Peddlers shall be classified, and rated as follows: When traveling with two or more horses the first class, when traveling with one horse, the second class, when traveling on foot the third class. Peddlers of the first class shall pay a license of \$7.00 per day, \$20.00 per month, or \$40.00 per quarter. Peddlers of the second class shall pay a license of \$5.00 per day, \$15.00 per month, or \$30.00 per quarter. Peddlers of the third class shall pay a license of \$3.00 per day, \$9.00 per month, or \$18.00 per quarter. Any person, except persons peddling news, papers, books, or religious tracts, and farmers, or persons peddling the products of their own farms, gardens, or milk ranches, or dairies, and wholesale agents selling to regular dealers only, who traveling from place to place in the City of Albany, Oregon, sell, or offer to sell at retail either by direct sale



or by taking subscriptions, or by sample, or by soliciting orders, any book, or books, merchandise, notions, pictures, and works of Art, or Commodities of any kind shall be deemed, a peddler under this Ordinance; Provided that a permit may be issued to any peddler of the strict class who may be physically unable to perform manual labor, or to any woman, residing in the City limits, who, by peddling maintains either herself, or family, or both, such permit to be issued by the City Recorder, upon the applicant for such permit filing in the office of said Recorder, a recommendation signed by the Committee on Licenses, of said City, authorizing and directing the Recorder to issue such permit.

Section 2: All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from, and after its approval by the Mayor.
