An Ordinance providing for the numbering of the houses and placing street signs at all street crossings within the City of Albany, Oregon, and declaring a penalty for refusal to place such numbers, and for detaching, destroying or removing such signs or numbers.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:-

Section 1.:- All the dwelling and business houses and places of business within the City of Albany shall be numbered as hereinafter provided, and the streets shall be designated by suitable signs at the crossings of such streets.

Section 2.:- The numbering of all the houses and places of business on streets running North & South shall commence at First Street, numbering South and North therefrom. All numbering on streets running East and West shall commence at Lyon Street and be numbered to the East and West therefrom.

Section 3.:- The numbering herein provided for shall be done under the direction of the Mayor of the City of Albany, and the letters and figures of all numbers shall be not less than two and 1/4 inches in height and width in proportion.

Section 4.:- The numbering shall be done by providing 100 numbers to each block. On streets running East and West the odd numbers shall be on the North side and the even numbers on the South side, and on streets running North and South the odd numbers shall be on the East side and the even numbers on the West side.

Section 5.:- That there shall be placed on some good secure place at the intersection of the streets, the name of the street both North & South and East and West and in the event there is no sign and well equal to set said name, there shall be erected a post 8 feet above the ground 6 inches square at the top, and 6 inches square at the base or ground, set into the ground 3 feet, all posts to be smooth, painted and painted.

Section 6.:- Every owner, tenant, person or persons having control of any dwelling or business house, or place of business, and who shall refuse or

neglect to number the same after having been notified to do so by the Mayor of the City of Albany, or by any officer under his direction, according to the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$5.00 or more than \$10.00 or be punished by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than three days and not more than six days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and such willful neglect or refusal to so number his house or place of business, shall constitute a separate offense under this Ordinance.

Section 7.:- That any person who shall draw, mark, deface or destroy any post or sign erected for the purpose of numbering the street or streets, or numbering the houses as hereinabove provided for, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction before the Recorder shall be subject to a fine in the sum of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$20.00 or be punished by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than three days, nor more than 10 days.

Section 8.:- This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its approval by the Mayor.
