

Ord 677

An ordinance to amend Section 7 of Ordinance No. 556, entitled "an ordinance regulating the use of motor vehicles in the City of Albany, Oregon, repealing all ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith and providing a penalty for violation hereof," passed by the council February 28, 1912, approved by the Mayor, March 27th, 1912.

The People of the City of Albany Do Ordain As Follows

Section 6. That Section 7 of Ordinance No. 556 entitled "An ordinance regulating the use of motor vehicles in the City of Albany, Oregon, repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and providing a penalty for violation hereof," passed the council February 28th, 1912, approved by the Mayor March 27th, 1912, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 7. Every motor vehicle driven upon or along any street, alley or other public way in the City of Albany shall be equipped with an alarm bell, horn or siren, and the same shall be sounded whenever and wherever the traffic and use of the street would demand such sounding of a reasonably prudent person, for the purpose of notifying pedestrians and others of the approach of such motor vehicle. Every motor vehicle operated within the City of Albany shall be equipped with a horn and siren, and the same shall at all times remain in use.
