

ORDINANCE No. 1118

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE Providing for the holding of a Special Election on Friday the 16th. day of May, 1924, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, for their adoption or rejection certain charter amendments, all as appears by Resolution No. 3, 1924 and Resolution No. 4, 1924 of the Common Council of the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, adopted on the 26th. day of March, 1924, designating the places for holding such election and appointing the officers for said Special Election and providing the manner and places for holding the same in said City and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That in the manner provided by law and as hereinafter provided and for the purposes set forth herein, a Special Election shall be held on Friday the 16th. day of May, 1924, in the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, commencing at the hour of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and continuing until the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M. of said day.

Section 2. That said Special Election shall be conducted, except as herein otherwise provided, in the same manner as general elections in said City are conducted. The following places are hereby designated as the places of holding such election:

- First Ward: County Recorder's Office in the Linn County Courthouse.
Second Ward: Sheriff's Office in Linn County Courthouse.
Third Ward: Madison School Building.

Section 3. The following named persons are hereby designated and appointed judges and clerks of said election in the respective wards as follows, to-wit:

Section 4. That previous to entering upon the discharge of their respective duties, said judges and clerks shall take and subscribe an oath in the following form, to-wit:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will perform the duties of judge (or clerk as the case may be) of election according to law and to the best of my ability and I will studiously endeavor to prevent fraud, deceit and abuse in conducting the same."

said oath to be administered to the judges and clerks by an officer authorized by law to administer oaths, and in the absence of any such officer one of the persons chosen to act as judge is hereby empowered to administer the oath to the judges and clerks of said election, and the person administering the oath shall cause an entry thereof to be made and subscribed by him and prefixed to the poll books.

Section 5. That if any judge of said Special Election as above named, shall fail to attend and serve at said election the voters present may elect another in his place, and if any clerk named shall fail to attend and serve at said election the judges of said election may appoint another in his place.

Section 6. The Recorder shall give notice of said Special Election by publication thereof in the Albany Daily Democrat, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Albany once a week and for two successive and consecutive weeks within thirty days next preceding the date of such election, such notice shall state the officers to be elected there at and the measure to be voted upon thereat and the places designated for holding such election, and the time thereof, which said notice shall be in substantially the following form:

First Ward : County Recorder's Office in the Linn County Courthouse.
Second Ward: Sheriff's Office in Linn County Courthouse.
Third Ward : Madison School Building.

which said Special Election shall be for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of the City of Albany a proposed charter amendment to the City charter of the City of Albany as provided in and by Resolution No. 3, 1924 adopted on the 26th. day of March, 1924, by the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, which amendment authorizes and directs the Council to appoint the City marshal of the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, the same as other appointive officers are now appointed, and for the same tenure of office, and for the further purpose of voting upon a proposed amendment to the City charter of the City of Albany submitted to the voters by the Council of the City of Albany,

Oregon, as provided by Resolution No. 4, 1924 adopted on the 26th. day of March, 1924, by the Council of the City of Albany, which amendment authorizes and directs the Council to co-operate with Linn County, Oregon, and the Oregon State Highway Commission of Oregon in constructing a bridge across the Willamette River from the City of Albany to Benton County, Oregon and providing for the issuance of bonds in the sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) to pay a portion of the cost of the construction of said bridge.

The Special Election will be held commencing at 8:00 o'clock A.M. and continuing until 8:00 o'clock P.M. of the same day.

A. G. Senders, Lola Junkin and Helen Poling have been selected as judges to conduct said Special Election in the First Ward; and Ella Swan and Cora E. Hopkins have been selected as Clerks of said election in the First Ward.

Lella Mitchell, Mattie Burggraf and Loretta J. Davis have been selected as judges to conduct said Special Election in the Second Ward; and Edna Laubner and Lucy Preston have been selected as Clerks of said election in the Second Ward.

W. A. Cox, Mary J. Harris and G. M. Knox, have been selected as Judges to conduct said Special Election in the Third Ward; and Elverta Williamson and Dora A. Bowers have been selected as clerks of said election in the Third Ward.

Section 7. That at said Special Election proposed amendments to the charter of the City of Albany shall be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection which said amendments are proposed by Resolution No. 3, 1924, and Resolution No. 4, 1924 passed by the Common Council of the City of Albany on the 26th. day of March, 1924.

Section 8. The Recorder shall cause to be printed a pamphlet form a true copy of the ballot titles and text of each measure to be submitted with the number and form in which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot, as provided in and by Resolution No. 3, 1924, and Resolution No. 4, 1924, and mail a copy thereof to each voter in the City of Albany, whose address he may have not later than five days before the date of said election at which such measure is to be voted upon. Preceding the copy of such act shall be a statement that the same will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Albany at a Special Election to be held on Friday May 16th. 1924.

Section 9. That the City Recorder shall cause to be printed and shall supply, a sufficient number of ballots, copies of poll books, ink,

pencils, stationery and other necessary and proper supplies for said election, and the marshall shall install voting booths and deliver ballot boxes and other supplies to the said judges and clerks of election at said voting places in due time for their use by the voters, judges, clerks and others interested in said Special Election at said time of holding the same.

Section 10. WHEREAS, Existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the peace, health, and safety, and an emergency exists and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
