

ORDINANCE NO. 2701

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF OREGON HIGHWAY COMMISSION FOR A PIPE LINE PERMIT; TO PROVIDE THAT JESKE BROS., CONTRACTOR SHALL FURNISH THE BOND REQUIRED IN SAID PERMIT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Recitals:

1. The City of Albany has contracted with Jeske Bros., Construction Company of Eugene, Oregon, for the construction of the South Industrial Area Sanitary trunk sewer.
2. The plans for the construction of this trunk sewer include two crossings of Highway 99E at certain points.
3. The State of Oregon Highway Commission requires the city to enter into an agreement for a permit to cross under Highway 99E and to bond in the amount of \$(10,000.00) Ten Thousand Dollars to provide guarantee of repairs of the highway.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1: That the Mayor and Council be authorized to enter into an agreement with the State of Oregon Highway Commission to secure a permit for the two crossings of Highway 99E included in the plans for the construction of the South Industrial Sanitary trunk sewer.

Section 2: That Jeske Bros., Contractor for the construction of the South Industrial Sanitary Trunk Sewer, be required to furnish the Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000.00) bond specified in the special provisions of the pipe line permit to be secured, said bond to guarantee repairs to the highway facilities should any damage occur thereto by reason of the construction of said sewer.

Section 3: Inasmuch as the provisions of this ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of Albany, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.
