REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Two pathways to stormwater regulation:
 - Clean Water Act 1972
 - Develop and implement water quality standards
 - Identify standards violations
 - Develop and implement TMDLs
 - Water Quality Act 1987
 - Regulate stormwater discharges



REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Clean Water Act 1972
 - Restore and maintain integrity of nations waters
 - Water Quality Standards
 - Regulate discharge of pollutants (NPDES permits)
 - Construction grants program
 - Stormwater discharges exempted

REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Water Quality Act 1987
 - Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)
 - 1990 Phase I = > 100,000, > 5 Acres Construction
 - Maximum Extent Practicable (MEP)
 - Prohibits non SW discharges into MS4
 - Industrial SW discharges regulated
 - Phased out construction grants program
 - Agricultural SW discharges exempted

FEDERAL REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Water Quality Act 1987
 - 1999 Phase II = > 50,000, > 1 Acres Construction
 - Maximum Extent Practicable (MEP)
 - Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP)
 - Six Minimum Control Measures
 - Public Education & Outreach
 - Public Involvement
 - Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination
 - Construction Site Runoff Control
 - Post Construction Runoff Control
 - Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping
 - Best Management Practices (BMPs)



OREGON'S REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Oregon accepts delegation from EPA
- Legislature passed laws Oregon Revised Statues (ORS)
 - Pollution policy menace to public health
 - Pollution harmful to wildlife, fish, aquatic species
 - Pollution impairs beneficial uses (domestic, ag, etc.)
 - Prevent new pollution and abate existing pollution
 - ORS 468B.015, ORS 468B.020




OREGON'S REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- Environmental Quality Commission rule authority
 - ORS 468B.010
- Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)
 - Implements rules (OARs) adopted by Commission
 - OAR 340, Division 41 establishes WQ standard
 - OAR 340, Division 45 establishes permit regulations










STRICTER REGULATIONS?

- 2003 9th Circuit Ruling EDC, NRDC v. EPA
 - Adequacy of Stormwater Controls
 - NPDES Permits for Logging/Forest Roads
- EPA Memorandum, November, 2014
 - Direction to Regions
 - Measurable Permit Requirements
 - Numeric Limits Where Feasible
- •December, 2014 EDC, NRDC v. EPA
 - 9th Circuit Petition
 - Revise Phase II Rules
 - Regulation of Forest Roads



WHAT'S NEXT

- DEQ Develops Phase II MS4 General Permit
 - Advisory Committee Stakeholders
 - Public Notice Draft December, 2015
 - Public Notice Final May, 2016
- Permit Term 5 Years
 - Phased Implementation
 - Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP)
 - Implement Six Minimum Control Measures
